

## UCDP: Strengthening Academic Staff Development in Mathematical and Statistical Sciences (UCDP – MaSS) Programme of the National Graduate Academy

### 2023 FUNDING GUIDELINES

In order to qualify for funding, an applicant has to be:

- A South African citizen or permanent resident of South Africa; and
- A full-time academic employee in mathematical and statistical sciences: mathematics, statistics and data science (or someone on a fixed term full-time contract continuous for at least 3 years) at any of the universities that have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the University of Pretoria (UP) which is the Lead Institution for the University Capacity Development Programme Grant (UCDP-MaSS) awarded by the Department of Higher Education and Training (DHET); and
- Graduate Academics (GA)/Early Career Academics (ECA)<sup>1</sup> satisfying one of the following:
  - Young academics registered for an M.Sc. or PhD (or intending to register within 12 months after receiving a grant);
  - Early Career Academics who completed their PhD's within the last 5 years, and have not yet reached professorial ranks. Late Entrants to Academia (Early Career Academics within five full-time active years in academia after completion of a PhD excluding any periods away from academia).

Anyone who qualifies for financial support can request funding, through their institution, for:

#### 1. Activity 1: Winter/Summer School travel and Board:

##### a. Workshop or Research School<sup>2</sup> attendance:

- **Local<sup>3</sup> workshop<sup>4</sup>:** Graduate academics/Early Career academics would qualify for a grant for travel, accommodation and subsistence to attend Graduate Workshops or Research Schools whose duration is at least 3 days or for Technical Workshops whose duration is at least 1 day. Maximum of 7 days accommodation. No one will be funded to attend commercial (for-profit) workshops.
- **International<sup>5</sup> workshop<sup>3</sup>:** Graduate academics/Early Career academics would qualify for a grant of up to R35 000 for travel, accommodation and subsistence to attend Graduate Workshops or Research Schools hosted by overseas academic organisations whose duration is at least 3 days. Academics from HDI's would qualify for a grant of up to R60 000
- **Online workshop participation:** Costs related to participation in online workshops can be covered.

- ##### b. Workshop organisation I:
- Academics (including Established Academics) from any of the universities that have signed an MoU with the University of Pretoria and who organise/host a graduate workshop or research school can apply for a grant of up to R150 000. This contribution may be used to cover the costs for invited speakers, both local and international, if they have managed to recruit at least five (5) Graduate Academics or Early Career Academics. Graduate Academics or Early Career Academics who wish to attend the workshop should apply directly, through their institutions, to University of Pretoria for funding.

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<sup>1</sup> The term "Graduate Academic" is used for any academic who qualifies for funding from the UCDP-MaSS grant and has not yet completed a PhD while "Early Career Academics" hold a PhD for less than five years at the time of application.

- c. **Workshop organisation II:** The Academic Committees of the National Graduate Academy for Mathematical and Statistical Sciences (Mathematics and Applied Mathematics, Statistics and Data Science) may request a group of up to four (4) academics to organise a Graduate Workshop or Research School on a theme aimed at Graduate Academics. A grant of up to R150 000 may be awarded to cover the costs for speakers, both local and international, venue hire and refreshments if the organisers manage to recruit at least ten (10) Graduate Academics or Early Career Academics. The event will be open to other postgraduate students and early career academics from any universities provided they can secure funding for travel and accommodation from other sources, for example, from the DSI/NRF Centre of Excellence for Mathematical and Statistical Sciences.
- d. **Mobility Grants**<sup>6</sup>: These can be allocated to Graduate Academics or Early Career Academics for the following:
- For a Graduate Academic to visit a local PhD supervisor at another institution for consultation, where the visit is at least a full week (equivalent of at least 5 working days). A maximum of R50 000 per annum will be awarded per applicant.
  - For an Early Career Academic to undertake a research visit or sabbatical leave at another institution locally or overseas where such a visit is at least for 6 weeks duration. A maximum of R35 000 per annum will be awarded per applicant to cover travel costs and accommodation and augment living expenses. HDI's would qualify for a grant of up to R60 000. A letter of invitation from the host will be required as well as the research programme to be undertaken and expected outcomes.
- e. **Once-off grants:** A once-off grant of up to R15 000<sup>7</sup> will be allocated to successful project beneficiaries to be utilised to support teaching and research activities. To benefit from this funding a full motivation from the applicant supported by the Head of Department will be required. Applicants must also submit a developmental plan which spells out what their personal developmental goals are and the expected outcomes for 2023, which is approved and signed by the HOD.
2. **Activity 2: Activities Planning Workshops:** The UCDP-MaSS Advisory Committee may schedule two face-to-face strategic planning meetings which will be funded under this item. Similarly, each Academic committee of the National Graduate Academy for Mathematical and Statistical Sciences may schedule three face-to-face strategic planning meetings which will also be funded under this item.
3. **Activity 3: Conference attendance**
- Local**<sup>8</sup> **Conference:** Graduate academics or Early Career Academics would qualify for a grant of up to R 10 000 to attend a local conference, for example, the annual meetings of the South African Statistical Association (SASA) and South African Mathematical Society (SAMS).
  - Regional**<sup>9</sup> **Conference:** Graduate academics or Early Career Academics would qualify for a grant of up to R 10 000 to attend a conference hosted in the SADC region, for example, the annual meetings of the Southern African Mathematical Sciences Association (SAMSA).
4. **Activity 5: Overseas Course/Conference Participation**<sup>10</sup>: Graduate academics or Early Career Academics from HDI's will qualify for a grant of up to R60 000 and those from other universities for a grant of up to R35 000, providing their paper or poster has been **accepted** by the conference organisers. Early career or graduate academics who have previously been funded for overseas conference attendance, will be required to submit evidence that the paper or poster presented at that conference has been written up and submitted for publication.

## 5. Activity 6:

- a. **Staff Replacement:** A once-off grant of R120 000 for a semester (6 months) duration for Graduate Academics in need of time off to concentrate on PhD or MSc research, to assist in completion of their studies within 2023 and publish an article at end of their studies. This will only be given to staff in the final stages of their degrees and the request needs motivation from the research supervisor and agreement from the applicant's Head of Department. *(For example, some of the following outcomes: Research Proposal; Preparation and/or submission of a research article; Dissertation or thesis Chapter; Preparation and submission of a final draft of a dissertation or thesis; Preparation and submission of a corrected dissertation or thesis (where applicable); Preparation and presentation of a paper at a Conference, Seminar or related event; Submission of final Dissertation / Thesis)*
- b. **Teaching time buy out:** GA's can apply for teaching time buy out for partial relief from teaching to allow staff to complete their studies. HOD's can employ interns in instances where a sizeable portion of GA's are pursuing Masters or Doctoral degrees. These interns could relieve them of some of the administrative and other routine responsibilities. *An amount equivalent to one-year internship is recommended where at least 3 GA's are pursuing further studies.* Rates according to the individual home institutions can be supported. Motivation by the HOD is required.

All funding contributions from the UCDP-MaSS Program depend on the availability of funds in the annual budget allocated for prioritised activities in 2023. Allocation will be on a *first come first serve basis per activity* and will only be allocated while there are available funds per activity. **Funds can only be utilised once official communication (including a Purchase Order) has been received from the University of Pretoria.**

Requests for funding received from academics who have not submitted a report to UP for previous funding, will be rejected. For reporting purposes to the Department of Higher Education and Training, applicants are required to provide all the information required in the application forms – incomplete application forms will not be processed. Early career academics are requested to demonstrate how their application fits with their career development plan (for example, goals with respect to research output, teaching portfolio, envisaged collaborations, promotion aspiration and NRF rating).
