While most doctoral programmes on the continent follow a "one student, one supervisor" approach, which includes mainly self-study, our programme at the University of Pretoria includes six months of compulsory structured seminars. These seminars include: These seminars include: Advanced research methods; Experimental design; Advanced data analysis tools; Dissertation writing and academic publishing; Public Admin Theory; Public Sector Ethics and Networks; Behavioural Public Administration; Organisational structure; Comparative Public Administration; Public Sector Innovation and Digital Transformation.

Applicants must have excellent English writing skills and math's ability, as students will be expected to write academic journal articles and perform quantitative statistical analyses and qualitative data analyses. Students must attend compulsory seminars held at the University of Pretoria Hatfield campus over 16 weekends in 2026. These weekends will include full-day Friday and full-day Saturday seminars and some weekdays. It is expected that students will complete their degree in three years.

Our programme will make a substantial investment in the skills development of students. Thus, we seek self-motivated applicants interested in becoming scholars in South Africa or internationally. In deciding whether the School of Public Management and Administration is suitable for completing your doctoral studies, please consider your career goals and review the research interests of the faculty members in the school. The closing date for international citizens is 31 August 2025.

The closing date for South African citizens is 30 September 2025.

Successful applicants will be notified by November 2025 at the latest.
