Guidelines Concerning the Differences between the Article, Dissertation, Mini-Dissertation & Thesis Options

There are common tendencies regarding the skills, competencies, length, depth of research, and type of methodology required by supervisors of articles, dissertations, mini-dissertations, and theses. The differences in length between the four documents cannot be reduced just to length; but rather the level of research and writing skills expected from students need to be articulated. It is equally clear that it is not necessarily the topic that is linked to a certain level. Most topics can be tackled at different degrees of intensity, but the methodological and theoretical approaches required, distinguish between the four documents.
