Checklist for students on how to avoid disciplinary processes during your time at UP

STOP - THINK - ASK

Ask yourself, is what I am about to do...

- illegal?
- possibly going to cause physical, ethical or reputational harm to myself?
- possibly going to cause physical, ethical or reputational harm to another person?
- possibly going to cause physical, ethical or reputational harm to the University of Pretoria?
- going to cause me to face possible disciplinary consequences or even criminal processes?
- going to immediately, but wrongfully, solve my challenge because I can't think of an ethical or legal solution?

If you answered "**yes**" to any of the questions, or you feel uncertain about the answer, consider making use of one or more of the options below:

- Contact a tutor, lecturer, the faculty administrator or head of residence for advice.
- Contact the Student Counselling Unit rather discuss your challenge with a person that may be in a position to offer you other solutions.

Academic misconduct

- Plagiarism
- Academic misconduct (cheating, colluding and the use of artificial intelligence)
- Failure to comply with formal examination or assessment instructions
- The possession of unauthorised material during an examination
- Research Misconduct
