Taking Democracy Seriously: Workers Survey 2014

This is a research project that is funded by the Rosa Luxemburg Institute (R1 million) and is a collaboration with other leading universities in South Africa. The research is a longitudinal study that takes place every 5 years prior to the national election and it has been running for 20 years. The aim of the project is to assess workers' perceptions of trade union democracy and how that is extended to broader political democracy in South Africa. The project is led by Dr Malehoko Tshoedi together with Prof. Andries Bezuidenhout and Ms Christine Bischoff (Wits University).
