Upon successful completion of the *Certification Program in Laban Movement Studies*, the qualification will be awarded by LIMS (New York). The successful candidate will receive the title *Certified Movement Analyst (CMA)*.

**Fee structure:** This fee structure is made possible due to a Memorandum of Understanding between the Laban Institute of Movement Studies (New York) and the University of Pretoria. As such, this fee structure is solely applicable for citizens of the various countries on the African continent. Proof of citizenship will have to be provided. The fees will be paid to the School of the Arts, University of Pretoria.

Mod 1: Foundation. R8000.00 fully paid before commencement of the module.

Mod 2: Expansion. R10 000.00 fully paid before commencement of the module.

Mod 3: Praxis. R12 000.00 fully paid before commencement of the module.

Mod 4: Qualifying. R12 000 fully paid before commencement of the module. Final Project: *Advising Fees:* As part of the Qualifying level of LIMS Certification Program in Laban Movement Studies, students will pay an additional \$1000 to cover the cost of ten (10) hours of advising support, and processing of their final project/certification.

If a student requires additional advising support beyond the initial ten (10) hours, the student will pay additional fees. The advising fee will be paid to UP in Rand value and will be influenced by the exchange rate as UP will pay the money over to LIMS.
