What is the justification for the return of radical surgery for advanced breast cancer?

Advanced breast cancer was deemed to be incurable and usually irresectable.

Advanced breast cancer is usually associated with metastatic disease in which case surgery is not part of primary treatment.

The advent of Neo-adjuvant treatment and Breast conservation showed that these ideas have to be revisited.

The possibility of cure improves dramatically with adequate local control.

Local control includes surgery and radiotherapy

Treatment of advanced breast cancer must include Chemotherapy, Surgery as well as Radiotherapy - preferably in that sequence

Metastatic disease is usually a contraindication to surgery.

Surgery is never indicated if clear margins can`t be obtained.

Reconstructive surgery could help improve resectability.
