EARLY COMMUNICATION INTERVENTION: A SHARED ROLE FOR AUDIOLOGISTS AND SPEECH-LANGUAGE THERAPISTS

The Annual CHRIB Seminar, Presented by the Dept of Communication Pathology, University of Pretoria

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The morning seminar consists of eight different presentations by audiologists and speech-language therapists on contemporary issues in early communication intervention (ECI) practice. The papers are presented by lecturers and a master's student in ECI, and cover the following topics: Auditory processing, Ethical guidelines in early communication intervention, international trends in ECI, Auditory neuropathy spectrum disorder, early communication assessment, hyperacusis in young children and risk factors for communication delay found in a rural district in Mpumalanga.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Participants will gain knowledge about assessment and intervention guidelines which may be applied in their clinical practice in ECI, either in audiology or in speech-language therapy. The focus is on evidence-based clinical practice, applicable in different South African contexts.
