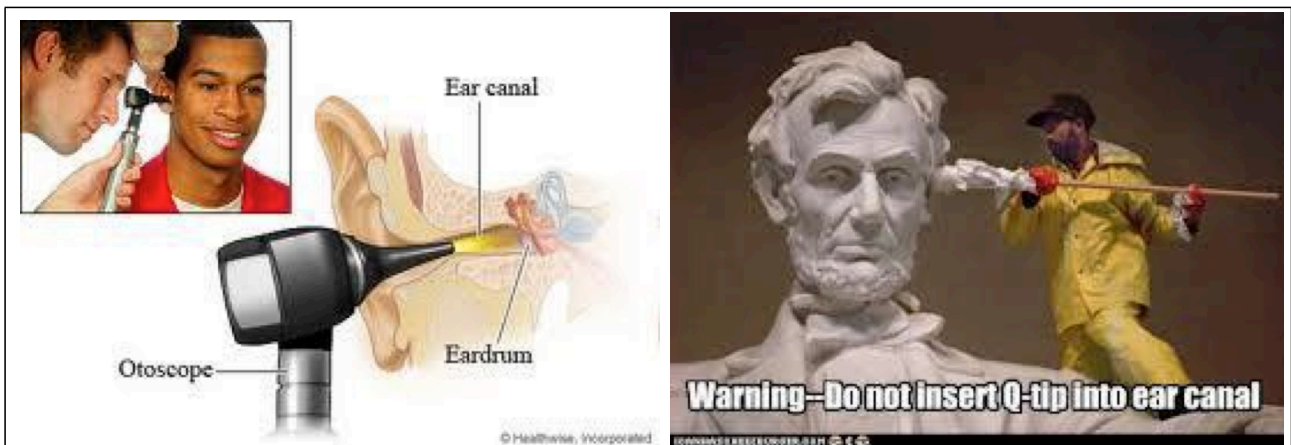

Course Contents & Outline
