Brief Description of the Programme:

This course has been structured in such a manner that attendees can chose to attend both sessions and just one. This seminar /workshop has been arranged in order to coincide with the International Stuttering Awareness day which is held internationally on the 22nd October annually.





Professionals who work with children and teenagers who stutter are encouraged to attend the seminar. Research has highlighted many new trends which in turn have an influence on how these learners should be managed in the home and classroom setting. Therapists and teachers alike often need assistance in managing these learners within a collaborative system. Often parents cannot consult regularly with teachers and therefore the school needs to help to support these learners.

The focus of the second session is for adults with a stuttering problem and how this problem impacts on the individual in the work place. The aim is to empower employees with knowledge so that they gain a better understanding of their position at work. Furthermore employers should learn more about employing persons who stutter. The main aim of the second session is to share information on legal matters in the work place. Professionals who counsel persons who stutter and employers will benefit from the discussion.

Who should attend the Course?
