COURSE BROCHURE

Brief Description of the Programme:

This course has been structured in such a manner that attendees can chose to attend the Thursday or Friday sessions. This conference and workshop has been arranged in order to coincide with the International Stuttering Awareness day which is held internationally on the 22nd October annually.

Professionals who work with persons who stutter are encouraged to attend the conference and workshop. Research has highlighted many new trends which in turn have an influence on how the effective management of stuttering. Management of stuttering encompasses a broad spectrum of approaches, some which are proven to work better than others. The question which arises is why? Researchers and therapists alike have come to a better understanding of what stuttering is and what it is not. The aim is to glean a better understanding of assessment and treatment of stuttering so as to base our clinical practice on evidence of effectiveness.

Who should attend the Course?

Speech-language therapists working with the pre-schooler/ school aged child and adult who stutters should attend.
