

Harvard South Africa Fellowship Program

2014-2015 academic year

Important Information:

- Since 1979, Harvard has been awarding six fellowships annually, intended for mid-career South Africans who in the past were educationally disadvantaged by law and resource allocation under apartheid. Candidates who have just completed, or who have not yet completed, a first degree are not typically selected, as the opportunity is meant for individuals in who have shown considerable skill in their chosen fields and leadership, and are expected to benefit from advanced training.
- Fellows submit their applications directly to the Harvard South Africa Fellowship Program at Harvard University. A committee of HSAFP alumni, Harvard alumni and the CAS Faculty Chair will interview the short-listed applicants in South Africa. Successful candidates must then apply to and be admitted at the specific Harvard school where they intend to study.
- Candidates applying during this current cycle are being considered for up to one year of study during the 2014-2015 academic year. The online application information can be found [here](#).

 - Master of Laws, Harvard Law School
 - Master of Public Health, Harvard School of Public Health
 - Non-Degree Programs:
 - Special Student Status, Harvard Graduate School of Arts and Sciences
 - Advanced Management Program, Harvard Business School
 - General Management Program, Harvard Business School
 - Program for Leadership Development, Harvard Business School
