- ADA offers a Fellowship to international students applying for graduate and undergraduate programs.
- This Fellowship covers the tuition fee, housing expense and books.
- Fellowship recipients are expected to cover all other expenses.
- The renewal of the Fellowship is on an annual basis and is dependent upon a minimum GPA requirement of 3.0.

#### Fellowship Requirements

- Applicants should first be admitted into ADA. Only admitted and enrolled students in good academic standing are eligible for the Fellowship.
- Previous work experience in public sector and/or commitment to serve in public sector
- Minimum annual GPA level of 3.0 is required for continuation of fellowship
- Recipients are expected to actively engage in ADA community.

Azerbaijan is located in the southeastern part of the Caucasus, descending to the Caspian Sea, between Iran and Russia. As the Caucasus Mountains are the conventional border between Europe and Asia, the northeast half of the country is in Europe and the southwest half is in Asia
