SYMPOSIUM BACKGROUND & PURPOSE

The 4th International Symposium on Service-Learning (ISSL): Service in Higher Education: Connecting the Global to the Local continues to build on the momentum generated by past symposia. The 1st ISSL entitled Service-Learning Models for the 21st Century: Intercommunity, Interdisciplinary, International was held at Stellenbosch University in Stellenbosch, South Africa, in 2005. The 2nd ISSL, entitled Service-Learning in Higher Education: Paradigms and Challenges, was held in 2007 at the University of Indianapolis in Indianapolis, Indiana, USA. The 3rd ISSL was held in November 2009 at the University of Indianapolis campus in Athens, Greece, and was titled Service-Learning in Higher Education: Educators, Communities, and Students. The emphasis of this 4th symposium will be an international focus that is geared towards linking faculty, students, and communities around the world. This international focus on global networking that will encompass several areas: international service-learning projects, collaborations between international institutions, strategies for integrating benefits of international experiences into local service-learning options, and service-learning aimed at cross-cultural understanding. Also included in the focus will be techniques on how to globally enhance service-learning and discussions on how international partnerships can collaborate with and learn from each other.

SYMPOSIUM FORMAT

The Symposium theme of *Connecting the Global to the Local* will be threaded throughout a variety of presentation types and formats to allow for meaningful dialogue among academic professionals, community partners, students, and other professionals. The Program will begin with an Opening Ceremony and Welcome Reception on the evening of Sept 23, 2011. Conference programming will occur on Sept 24 and 25th from 9am to 6pm. The preliminary program will be available on the conference Web site by June 30, 2011.

Pre-conference and post-conference excursions will be available for an additional fee. The symposium organizing committee will assist participants in making travel arrangements. The symposium will organize a *China: New and Old* tour on September 19-23 (Beijing, Xi'an, and Ningbo) and September 26-27 (Shanghai). Participants are welcome to participate in both or one of the excursions. The estimated cost and the tour details will be available on March 31, 2011, upon request. Participants are welcome to participate in one or both of the excursions.

PRESENTATION FORMATS

Submissions are being accepted for scholarly presentations and interactive workshops. All submissions should demonstrate a connection to the symposium theme—*Connecting the Global to the Local.* (The presentations that relate to service-learning projects at the international, international-local, or local level with possible international sites in the future are most welcome.)

Scholarly Presentations: Scholarly presentations can be in one of two formats—a 20 minutes platform presentation or a poster presentation. Scholarly presentation submissions should identify one of the following types:

(1) Theoretical: These presentations will integrate published theory with service-learning or will introduce new theoretical insights. Abstract headings should read: Theory and Insights.

- (2) Method/Model: These presentations will introduce unique service-learning programs. Abstract headings should read: Purpose, Description, Outcomes (Assessment), and Insights.
- (3) Research: These presentations will present the design and outcomes from service-learning that have been measured and assessed using scholarly principles. Abstract heading should read: Purpose/Hypothesis, Methods, Results, Conclusions and Suggestions.

Interactive Workshops: Interactive workshops require active participation by the conference attendees. Submissions should identify learning objectives for the participants. The role of the presenter and the level or the nature of participation by the attendees must be specified.

GUIDELINES FOR PRESENTATION SUBMISSIONS

Submissions should be made online via the formatted proposal forms on the symposium Web site at http://www.uindy.edu/issl2011. Submissions should include:

- 1. Presenter (s) information (name, mailing and emailing addresses, and phone and fax numbers for all presenters)
- 2. Selected format of presentation
- 3. Title and affiliation (your institution and organization)
- 4. Proposal or abstract (in English, not to exceed 300 words)
- 5. Biographical data (in English, not to exceed 200 words)
