

University of Pretoria Honours Orchestral Talent

Join the University of Pretoria Symphony Orchestra in honouring its orchestral talent in their annual Concerto Festival on 13 September 2013 at 20:00 in the Musaion.

The concert will feature works played by principals, as well as two supporting players, in the orchestra. Anthony Cloete, the principal clarinetist will be playing the first movement from Spohr's Clarinet Concerto No 1. Simon du Toit who is a player in the first violin section, will display his versatility in playing the first Movement from Mozart's Piano Concerto No 21.

Donovan Hattingh who joined the orchestra for the first time this year, will be performing the third movement from Weber's Clarinet Concerto in F Minor. Jaco Prinsloo, the principal horn, will delight with the first movement from Glier's Concert for French Horn.

The flute section bubbles over with immense talent where all three players in the section will offer their renditions of their chosen pieces for orchestra. Reneé Hatzenberg, the principal flautist along with Ruth Liprini will be performing the Allegro from Cimerosa's Concerto for Two Flutes. Ms Liprini will then perform the first movement from Chamanade's Concerto for Flute and Gianfiranco Vizzini will deliver a superb performance of the title song from the motion picture feature, Skyfall.

A soupcon from Shostakovich and Albeniz will accentuate this tantalizing programme.
