7.2	The Land Programme works towards the protection of key species and landscapes through land purchases and enabling the sustainable management of secured landscapes through close partnerships with key conservation partners.				
7.3	The Sustainable Agriculture Programme works with producers and producer associations to encourage and support the development and implementation of sustainable agricultural practices in key industries, such as wine, fruit, dairy and sugar.				
7.4	The Sustainable Fisheries Programme works with key industry partners, conservation agencies and government to promote an ecosystems approach to fisheries, promoting sustainable fisheries practices through consumer education and promoting marine conservation without compromising livelihoods of dependent fishing communities.
