Conference on Constitutional Challenges in South Sudan Starts in Juba

The National Constitution Review Commission (NCRC) in collaboration with the Max Planck Institute for Comparative Public Law and International law (iviPIL) and the Institute for International and Comparative law in Africa at the faculty of law, University of Pretoria (ICLA) began a conference on Constitutional challenges in South Sudan yesterday The conference will take four days from 20-22 Aug 2012 at the New Sudan Hotel and is funded by the German Foreign Office The first agenda is to address the challenges and possible options for the future constitution of South Sudan, one year after the Country gained its Independence and when the Transitional Constitution of the Republic of South Sudan 2011 entered into force

The conference was officially inaugurated by Professor Akolda Maan Fier, Chairperson of the (NCRC), Ms Lepel, Deputy Director -General for

Global issues of the German Foreign Office, Ms Hilde Johnson, UN Special Representative and Head of the United Nations Mission in South Sudan, Professor Rudiger Wolfrum, Director of the Max Planck Institute for Comparative Public Law and International Law (MPIL) and Professor Erika de Wet..coordinator of

The subsequence two days of the conference will be a closed technical meeting for the honorable members of the NCRC International experts from Tanzania. South Africa, Ethopia, Cameroon, india and the United States of America will present case studies which may serve as useful points of reference for the discussion on the future Constitution of South Sudan Among the International experts is Joseph S Warioba, Former Vice President of Tanzania and current chairperson of the Constitutional review commission ın Tanzania

MP Claims Promised Revenue **Portion not Sent to Central Equatoria State**

Member of Parliament (MP) responsible for Peace, Human Rights and Humanitarian Affans, Central Equatoria State Legislative Assembly Jacob Kwiyasuk Isaac stated that last Wednesday the Minister of Finance Jacob Aligo presented à comprehensive financial report demanded by the parliament

On Saturday during a briefing of journalists in Juba about matters related to CES Parliament he said that the report of the Minister revealed that since revenue collection was confined to Revenue Authority in Central Equatoria the State has not been received for three (3) months since centralization of this program

He urged Revenue Authority which has the responsibility of collecting all taxes to fulfill its obligation of remitting the dues of the State as agreed upon



He said as a devout member of Sudan People's Liberation Movement (SPLM) party he supports the policy of taking towns to the villages. But at this period of centralization of revenue collection, services have become difficult

Kwiyasuk urged that members of the National Government especially Ministers when visiting areas of their constituencies they the MPs could accompany them to make their visits useful and successful.
