LLM through Research in Human Rights; Legal History, Comparative Law and Legal Philosophy; Mercantile Law; Private Law; Procedural Law and Public Law.

LLM through Course Work in Child Law; Constitutional and Administrative l aw: Corporate Law: Criminal Law: Estate Law: Family Law: Human Rights and Democratisation in Africa; Insolvency Law; International Law; Intellectual Property Law, International Trade and Investment Law in Africa: Labour Law: Law and Political Justice: Law of Contract; International Air, Space and Telecommunication Law: International Human Rights Law and HIV in Africa; Mercantile Law; Multidisciplinary Human Rights (an MPhil in Multidisciplinary Human Rights is available in the Faculty of Humanities); Private Law; Procedural Law: Socio-economic Rights: Theory and Practice and Tax Law.

LLD

The LLD (doctorate) entails a research programme regarding an approved topic in law. It requires a preceding oral examination, a written thesis which makes an original contribution to legal science and a subsequent public oral defence of the thesis.
