NATIONAL CONFERENCE ON GLOBAL CHANGE

Birchwood Hotel Boksburg, 26 – 28 November 2012

The Department of Science and Technology (DST) and the National Research Foundation (NRF), in collaboration with the Department of Environmental Affairs, are organizing a three days national conference on Global Change. The conference will take place at **Birchwood Hotel and Conference Centre, Boksburg** (www.birchwoodhotel.co.za) on 26 – 28 November 2012 under the auspices of the Hon. Minister of Science and Technology.

Strategic Context

Following the finalization of the Global Change Implementation Framework, one of the decisions by the global change research and policy communities was to have an annual event to reflect on the progress in, and showcase products and services emerging from the implementation of the Framework. These annual events would run from 2011 to 2018, and would consist of dedicated high level publications alternating with national conferences.

The first event in this series was the publication in 2011 of 'Observations on Environmental Change in South Africa' championed by the South African Environmental Observation Network (SAEON). This dedicated high profile volume documents the latest observations of Global Change trends and their policy implications. The national Global Change Conference will constitute the high profile annual event in 2012.

Conference Theme

The central theme of the 2012 Global Change conference is: "Understanding Global Change for Innovation towards a Resilient Society".

Purpose and Objectives

The overall purpose of the biennial conference is:

- to grow existing global change programmes, and introduce new ones to enhance the implementation of the GCGC and support the country's sustainable development and green economy ambitions; and
- to provide insight into the GC-related activities and their contribution to key national imperatives

The specific objectives of the 2012 conference are:

- to provide a platform for key global change stakeholders to share current South African research and innovation initiatives and interventions that are related to the global change grand challenge;
- to enhance the uptake of GC-related science/research in support of decision making:
- to facilitate networking for key global change stakeholders in the country and stimulate partnerships to enhance implementation of the Global Change Grand Challenge; and
- to drive the process of building the next generation of young scientists by creating a forum for them to present their research and interact with experienced scientists

This conference is expected to bring together approximately 250 professional and young researchers of the key global change programmes, the broader R&D community, business,

industry, government, civil society and funding agencies to present and discuss latest developments in global change research, as well as technology and policy solutions to mitigate the impacts of change.

Structure

The conference will be structured into five major components:

- Plenary sessions for invited keynote lectures and selected research/technical papers
- Thematic parallel sessions for oral presentation of selected research/technical papers, and case studies;
- Poster sessions:
- Multi-stakeholder dialogue and panel discussions; and
- Exhibitions of products and services scientific and non-scientific

These activities will span over two and half days (see draft programme in Annexure 1).

Call for papers

The organisers will welcome abstracts presenting research results, technological innovation, management policy or products and services in any of the sub-themes below. The subthemes are broadly grouped into four categories in alignment with the four knowledge challenges of the Global Change Research Plan

- A. Understanding a changing planet.
 - i. Dynamics of the oceans around Southern Africa
 - ii. Carbon fluxes in the biosphere
 - iii. Dynamics of the Earth systems
 - iv. Improving Climate predictions Down-scaling Climate models
- B. Reducing the human foot print.
 - Conserving Biodiversity and Ecosystem services
 - ii. Sustainable production and consumption
 - iii. Institutional integration and governance

C. Adapting the way we live

- i. Water resources use and governance
- ii. Coastal management
- iii. Food Security
- iv. Preparing for extreme events
- v. Sustainable Urban development
- vi. Deliberative transformation and behaviour change

D. Innovation for sustainability

- i. Reducing risks and enhancing resilience to change
- ii. Improving Resilience and Capability (Complexity Science)
- iii. Technological innovation including Geo-engineering
- iv. Green Economy

- v. Social Learning
- vi. Methodologies for effective dialogue and negotiation

All abstracts will be reviewed by the Conference Scientific Advisory Committee which will advise on the acceptance and recommended mode of presentation (oral or poster). All abstracts must be submitted to Ms. Ntombizini Manana (Ntombizini Manana (Ntombizini.manana@nrf.ac.za) on or before **26 October 2012**.

Guidelines for Preparation of Abstracts

- Abstracts must be submitted as MS Word file and should not be longer than 1 A4 page laid out in the following format:
 - a. The preferred font type: ARIAL
 - b. Font size of 14pt for title; 10pt for affiliations; and 11pt for the text
 - c. Line spacing of 1.5
 - d. Left margin of 3 cm and 2.5 cm for the top, right and bottom margins
- Authors are required to provide 5 7 keywords for indexing purposes
- The name and contact details (e-mail and phone) of the corresponding author must be clearly specified. All communications will be done with this author only.
- If applicable, literature citations should be marked in the text as numbered end notes listed serially at the end of the abstract.
- The conference secretariat may undertake minor re-formatting but submissions that are grossly aberrant will be returned to authors.

Registration

Registration for the conference is free. All interested participants are required to complete the conference registration form (Annexure 2) and return by email to the address indicated on the form. The registration deadline has been further extended to **31 October 2012**. Please note that confirmation of attendance is on a first-come first-serve basis.

Logistics

The conference organizers will provide a free conference package to all registered participants. This includes the conference kit, lunches and refreshments (tea/coffee breaks). With the exception of invited speakers and sponsored students all participants are expected to make their own travel and accommodation arrangements.
