The successful information designer is a highly qualified person who plays a vital role in creating the contemporary visual, spatial and digital environment. A skilled designer conveys meaningful and powerful messages in a variety of media to diverse people. The Bachelor of Arts in Information Design programme incorporates design strategies and design applications in a range of media. Our students learn to design with their heads, hearts, and hands to equip them for local and global communication design careers.

Information design as a discipline:

- establishes visual identities for people, organisations or products;
- visually informs, directs, explains and describes a product and/or organisation;
- persuades people to change their behaviours;
- creates an entertaining, aesthetic or intriguing experience; and
- creates meaningful and socially responsible design systems.

Graduates will leave the programme with confidence and versatility that will enable them to establish themselves in any of the above areas of professional practice. They can expect to be knowledgeable about current professional practice developments and be sensitive to how design can impact society and bring about social change.

This is the only broad-based professional (NQF level 8) design degree of its kind in Africa. It is unique in terms of both its scope and depth and is recognised as such by both the creative industry and design educators.

Students who excel at this programme have an aptitude for both strategic and creative thought. They are very open and conscientious and have a keen interest in communicating with and serving people with integrity

Admission Requirements

Important information for all prospective students for 2026

The admission requirements below apply to all who apply for admission to the University of Pretoria with a National Senior Certificate (NSC) and Independent Examination Board (IEB) qualifications. <u>Click here</u> for this Faculty Brochure.

* To retain admission, you must obtain an APS of at least 28 in the NSC.

* In addition to the UP application, it is compulsory for applicants to submit an online portfolio to the Information Design division by 30 June. Those who fail to do this will end up with an incomplete application and will therefore not be considered for the selection process.

Life Orientation is excluded when calculating the APS.

Applicants currently in Grade 12 must apply with their final Grade 11 (or equivalent) results.

Applicants who have completed Grade 12 must apply with their final NSC or equivalent qualification results.

Please note that meeting the minimum academic requirements does not guarantee admission.

Successful candidates will be notified once admitted or conditionally admitted.

Transferring students

A transferring student is a student who, at the time of applying at the University of Pretoria (UP) is/was a registered student at another tertiary institution. A transferring student will be considered for admission based on NSC or equivalent qualification and previous academic performance. Students who have been dismissed from other institutions due to poor academic performance will not be considered for admission to UP.

Closing dates: Same as above.

Returning students

A returning student is a student who, at the time of application for a degree programme is/was a registered student at UP, and wants to transfer to another degree at UP. A returning student will be considered for admission based on NSC or equivalent qualification and previous academic performance.

Note:

• Students who have been excluded/dismissed from a faculty due to poor academic performance may



be considered for admission to another programme at UP, as per faculty-specific requirements.

- Only ONE transfer between UP faculties and TWO transfers within a faculty will be allowed.
- Admission of returning students will always depend on the faculty concerned and the availability of space in the programmes for which they apply.

Closing date for applications from returning students

Same as above.

Selection Process

The selection process has three steps:

Step 1: Application at UP

UP applications for the year 2026 open on 1 April 2025. You must apply <u>online</u>. The closing date for UP applications for the Bachelor of Arts in Information Design is **30 June 2025**.

Step 2: Application at Information Design

- You will be required to complete an **online ID selection form**, which consists of question sections and a digital portfolio selection. This form is an interactive PDF document that can be completed digitally, using Adobe Acrobat Reader (please ensure that you have the most recent version of <u>Adobe</u> <u>Acrobat Reader DC</u>).
- The online ID selection form requires you to answer questions about yourself, including education, personal interests and achievements, motivation for study, etc.
- The online ID selection form will facilitate the sharing of your digital portfolio, which comprises 1 x original drawing from observation, 3 x original photographs, and 8 x additional work. The ID Selection Procedure document provides detailed information about the format and content of the portfolio requirements.
- The deadline for submission is 30 June 2025. You are required to submit your completed ID selection form via email to <u>visualarts.selection@up.ac.za</u>. No late applications will be accepted.

Step 3: Book an appointment for an Interview and selection test

You must book a provisional appointment for your interview and concept test by 30 June 2025. Interviews and selection tests will take place during July 2025. Please phone (012) 420-2353 to make an



appointment for one of these dates (once you have completed Step 2). Kindly note that if you do not finalise your interview and test date by 30 June 2025, you risk the chance of losing an opportunity to continue with the selection process (even if you successfully meet the requirements of the merit selection process).

Minimum duration of study

4 years, full-time
