Selection Process

A limited number of students will be admitted to this programme based on the following criteria:

- Strong legal writing, research and reading skills, as evidenced by the applicant's written motivation to be admitted into the programme, which ought to reference relevant scholarship and laws, as well as other relevant legal writing submitted by the applicant
 - Prior knowledge of South African Environmental Law and International Environmental Law, in the form of certificate courses, and/or an undergraduate elective module in Environmental Law, and/or other postgraduate study in Environmental Law, and/or relevant work experience
 - A commitment to the fulfilment of section 24 of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996 and an appreciation that the environment creates the conditions in which social justice can occur
