Verwys asseblief na die Engelse weergawe vir meer inligting.

Toelatingsvereistes

Toelatingsvereistes:

- 'n Toepaslike honneursgraad in Statistiek word vereis.
- 'n Minimum gemiddelde punt van 65% in BComHons Statistiek of 'n toepaslike honneursgraad van 'n geakkrediteerde instelling.
- Studente vanaf ander geakkrediteerde instellings moet 'n toelatingseksamen slaag.
- Studentegetalle word beperk tot 'n maksimum van 20 insluitend studente van die MSc (Wiskundige Statistiek) MSc (Toegepaste Statistiek) en MCom (Wiskundige Statistiek) grade.
- Keuring is gebaseer op die prestasie in die vorige graad sowel as die toelatingseksamen in die geval van studente van ander geakkrediteerde instellings.
- Die Departementshoof behou die reg voor om addisionele modules voor te skryf.
- Applikante se navorsingsvoorstel moet inlyn wees met die Departement se navorsingsfokus.

Hoof kurrikuluminligting:

- (i) Die graad word toegeken op grond van 'n verhandeling oor 'n onderwerp uit die studierigting vir die honneursgraad met dien verstande dat die Dekaan op aanbeveling van die departementshoof kan goedkeur dat die verhandeling deur die voltooiing van 'n voorgeskrewe aantal module-krediete en die voltooiing van 'n miniverhandeling vervang word.
- (ii) Die modules wat aangebied word kredietwaardes en leerplanne is op aanvraag by die betrokke departementshoof verkrygbaar.
- (iii) Die module EBW 801 (of enige ander module in Navorsingsmetodologie soos deur die betrokke departement vereis) is verpligtend vir alle programme met dien verstande dat die Dekaan in uitsonderlike gevalle en op aanbeveling van die betrokke departementshoof kan goedkeur dat daar van hierdie bepaling afgesien kan word.

Addisionele vereistes

1. A candidate may be refused admission to a master's degree by the head of the department if he/she does not comply with the standard of competence in the subject as determined by the department – with the proviso that a candidate who does not comply with the required level of competence, may be admitted, provided that he/she completes additional study assignments and/or examinations.
2. The head of department concerned may set additional admission requirements.
3. Specific departments have specific requirements for admission.

4. The number of students will be determined in line with the growth strategy of the University of Pretoria as approved by the Executive.
5. Allowance will be made for the diversity profile of students.
6. A completed Postgraduate Diploma in Economic and Management Sciences can also be considered for admission to the Master's programme in Entrepreneurship.

All MCom candidates need to have adequate knowledge of Management, Financial and Economic Sciences as well as Statistics, as determined by the head of department concerned, in consultation with the Dean.

A pass mark in the following modules:

- Financial accounting 1 (FRK 111 and FRK 121/122);
- Economics 1 (EKN 110 and EKN 120);
- Statistics 1 (STK 110 and STK 120) and one of the following:
- Business management 1 (OBS 114 and OBS 124); or
- Marketing management 1 (BEM 110 and BEM 122); or
- Public administration 1 (PAD 112 and PAD 122); or
- Industrial and organisational psychology (BDO 110 and BDO 120) or equivalent modules passed at another institution as approved by the head of the department concerned in consultation with the Dean.

Eksamens en slaagvereistes

The pass mark for both a dissertation and a mini-dissertation is 50%. The provisions regarding pass requirements for dissertations, contained in General Regulation G.12.2, apply mutatis mutandis to mini-dissertations.

A pass mark of at least 50% is required in the examination of each module.

Navorsing

Dissertations/mini-dissertations/research reports, curricula and modules

1. The degree programme requires that a dissertation/mini-dissertation/research article must be submitted in a field of study chosen from the fields covered for the honours degree, provided that the Dean may, on the recommendation of the head of department concerned, approve the replacement of the required dissertation by the successful completion of a prescribed number of module credits and a mini-dissertation/research article.
2. Information on modules, credits and syllabi is available, on request, from the head of department concerned.
3. A module in Research Methodology is compulsory in all programmes. The Dean may, on the recommendation of the head of department concerned, waive the prerequisites.
4. Sufficient number of bound copies of the thesis/dissertation must be submitted to the Head: Student Administration for examination, after permission is granted by the supervisor.

Article for publication

A dean may require, before or on submission of a dissertation, the submission of a draft article for publication to the supervisor. The draft article should be based on the research that the student has conducted for the dissertation and be approved by the supervisor concerned. The supervisor should then have the opportunity to take the paper through all the processes of revision and resubmission as may be necessary and/or appropriate in order to achieve publication.

Submission of dissertation

A dissertation is submitted to the Head: Student Administration, before the closing date for the various

graduation ceremonies as announced annually.

For examination purposes, a student must, in consultation with the supervisor, submit a sufficient number of bound copies of the dissertation, printed on good quality paper and of good letter quality, to the Head: Student Administration. Permission to submit the dissertation in unbound form may be obtained from the supervisor concerned on condition that a copy of the final approved dissertation is presented to the examiners in bound format or electronic format.

In addition to the copies already mentioned, each successful student must submit a bound paper copy as well as two electronic copies of the approved dissertation to the Head: Student Administration in the format specified by the faculty and in accordance with the minimum standards set by the Department of Library Services, before 15 February for the Autumn graduation ceremonies and before 15 July for the Spring graduation ceremonies, failing which the degree will only be conferred during a subsequent series of graduation ceremonies.
