Of particular interest is the development of international organisations and their role in influencing and regulating the global business environment; the formation and development of international regimes such as those governing multilateral trade and development; trade and international labour standards; alternatives to intergovernmental regulation such as voluntary Codes of Conduct, Codes of Business Principles and their efficacy. In essence, this module offers an in-depth understanding of the complex international environment in which managers, business organisations and governments operate.
