### Admission requirements

1. Relevant honour's degree with specialisation in Visual Culture Studies, Art History, Image Studies, Digital Humanities, Fine Arts, Design Studies, Digital Media, Communication and Media Studies, Publishing **or** relevant relevant four-year bachelor's degree
2. A cumulative weighted average of at least 70% for the honours degree or four-year bachelor's degree
3. In the case of a four-year degree an average of 70% is required for the research component
4. An admissions essay may be required
5. An entrance examination may be required

Note: Additional work/modules may be required in order to reach the desired level of competency

### Additional requirements

Prospective students may be required to submit an admissions essay or to sit for an examination or to do additional work/modules to enable them to reach the desired level of study.

An acceptable level of proficiency in English is required.

An approved statement of intent is required.
