Political dynamics (Macro)

A theoretical basis and framework is provided for the description, analysis and classification of political and policy problems. Amongst others a study is made of the issues of colonialism and post-colonialism, democratisation, authoritarianism and the development of the state in Africa, in the context of a globalising world.
