Programme information

The degree programme comprises the following components:

A. Theoretical section

A core curriculum with coursework has to be followed and passed.

B. Practical section

Students are required to do a practical clinical internship which is assessed through on-site and group supervision and which needs to be passed before the MMus (Music Therapy) degree can be conferred.

C. Dissertation

Admission requirements

- 1. Four-year BMus degree **or** four-year bachelor's degree in related fields (e.g. psychology, speech therapy, occupational therapy, social work or education) **or** relevant honours degree
- 2. Music proficiency as determined by a proficiency test
- 3. A cumulative weighted average of at least 70% for the BMus degree or the four-year bachelor's degree
- 4. Psychology passed at final-year level of the bachelor's degree

Psychology up to third year level is an entrance requirement for this programme:
