### Module content

The module focuses on the basic administration strategies and skills relevant to the Early Childhood Care and Development centre. The key content areas of the module include administrative strategies, guidelines and procedures for effective management of early childhood centres; creating and maintaining healthy and safe teaching and learning environment for both children and educators; and keeping and maintaining up-to-date day-to-day income and expenditure and financial records and other tangible and intangible assets of the ECCE centre. A First Aid practical demonstration will be also part of this module where students will be taught basic first aid skills.

### **University of Pretoria Programme Qualification Mix (PQM) verification project**

The higher education sector has undergone an extensive alignment to the Higher Education Qualification Sub-Framework (HEQSF) across all institutions in South Africa. In order to comply with the HEQSF, all institutions are legally required to participate in a national initiative led by regulatory bodies such as the Department of Higher Education and Training (DHET), the Council on Higher Education (CHE), and the South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA). The University of Pretoria is presently engaged in an ongoing effort to align its qualifications and programmes with the HEQSF criteria. Current and prospective students should take note that changes to UP qualification and programme names, may occur as a result of the HEQSF initiative.
